

Margin of Error ± 2.45%

#### Methodology

Multi-frame survey among 1,600 registered voters nationwide conducted November 3 – 10, 2021. Respondents were selected randomly from opt-in panel participants, as well as two independent phone samples from Data Trust, one for landline and one for cell phone.

33% online, 33% landline, 33% cell phone

Sampling controls were used to ensure that a proportional and representative number of respondents were interviewed from such demographic groups as age, gender, race, and geographic region.

Gender breakdown: 48% men – 52% women

This survey includes two oversamples: 1600 self-identified Republicans and 1600 self-identified Conservatives


±2.45% overall margin of error at the 95% confidence interval for the base survey and oversamples. M.O.E.s for subgroups are larger.




## Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his responsibilities as President?






## For whom did you vote in the 2020 Presidential election: Donald Trump, Joe Biden, or another candidate?






## Do you think things in this country are headed in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?






## Regardless of how you voted in the last election, do you typically vote for Republican or Democrat candidates?






## Which of the following would you say is the most important issue when considering your vote? – Base N1600






## Which of the following would you say is the most important issue when considering your vote? – Republican OS N1600






### Which of the following would you say is the most important issue when considering your vote? – Conservative OS N1600






## What would you say is the most important issue when considering costs of living?






## In electing candidates for office, which would you say is more important to you, economic issues or cultural issues?






#### Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The federal government is too big.






#### Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The federal government is too big. – Base N1600






#### Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The federal government is too big. – Republican OS N1600








## Thinking back to the 2020 election, were taxes a factor in deciding for whom you would cast your vote for President?




## Do you believe the national debt is primarily caused by too much spending or not taxing enough?




## Do you agree or disagree that right to work laws, meaning laws that protect the freedom to choose whether or not to join a labor union in the workplace, should be eliminated?





### Do you agree or disagree that it is important to strengthen private sector unions in the United States?






## Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of The American Jobs Plan, Biden's plan for infrastructure?






## Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the Build Back Better Plan, Biden's plan for economic improvement and recovery?






## Do you believe significantly increasing the amount of money spent by the federal government will lead to more inflation?






## How personally worried are you about inflation affecting you and your household?






### Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The need to raise the debt ceiling is due to Democrats' proposed spending packages.




## Do you agree or disagree that after 20 years, it was time to bring home the U.S. troops from Afghanistan?






#### Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling the withdrawal of U.S. troops and evacuation of U.S. citizens from Afghanistan?




### Do you approve or disapprove of President Biden's handling of U.S. relations with China?





## Is the United States-China relationship too friendly, not friendly enough, or about right?





#### Are you concerned with the spread of Critical Race Theory in our nation's schools?






## Do you agree or disagree that states should enact policies to stop schools from teaching students that they are complicit in racism based on the color of their skin?






#### Do you agree or disagree that the education system in America is "systematically racist"?





# Which of the following is the greater challenge facing American students today, racism in education, or low-quality schools?






#### Do you approve or disapprove of President Biden's handling of border security and immigration policy?






## Would knowing that President Biden and Democrats in Congress are using Biden's Build Back Better Act to give amnesty to illegal immigrants make you more or less likely to support it?





#### How worried are you about the impact of record-high illegal immigration on government spending and welfare programs?








#### Do you believe businesses should require their employees to be vaccinated or lose their jobs?






### Do you believe local governments should require police and firefighters to be vaccinated or lose their jobs?




#### Do you approve or disapprove of how Joe Biden is handling the issue of crime?






#### On each of the following issues, please indicate whether you trust Republicans or Democrats more... Police Funding






### On each of the following issues, please indicate whether you trust Republicans or Democrats more... Crime






### On each of the following issues, please indicate whether you trust Republicans or Democrats more... Capital Punishment








#### Do you support or oppose the Black Lives Matter movement?





Do you support or oppose reducing the budget of the police department in your community, even if that means fewer police officers, if the money is shifted to programs related to mental health, housing, and education?






## Election Integrity

#### Executive Summary

The vast majority of Republicans (78%) and Conservatives (82%) have an unfavorable opinion of the American Jobs Plan

Over 6-in-10 (65%) support initiatives like Voter ID laws

89% of Republicans and 90% of Conservatives are supportive of these initiatives

The majority of respondents (51%) believe that the government should not require everyone to get the COVID vaccine

This number increases when talking about Republicans (80%) and Conservatives (83%)

Over 8-in-10 Republicans (82%) and Conservatives (86%) are concerned with the spread of CRT in schools
